**ORGANIC CATTLE (240)**

What a show of Organic cattle this month with well over 200 head presented for sale. Trade was electrifying from start to finish with a cracking consignment from Sargent & Waight a particular highlight. Their quality run of Charolais and South Devon cattle topped the trade with their steers to £1300, £1250, £1115 and £1030 on 18 occasions. Their heifers topped at £1210, £1172, £1100, £1080 and £1020 on 24 occasions. Other well presented cattle from Chave & Foster sold very well with their Angus steers peaking at £1290, Hereford steers at £1095 and Simmental heifers at £1155. Other smart Angus (18mo) from Hardwick Brothers wanted with their steers to £1170 and heifers to £972. Cracking weaned Angus steers (6mo) from AT Garrett sparked brisk bidding from £725 to £755. Limousin (16mo) sold well with steers to £1000 and heifers to £902 both from J & M King Brain whilst Blues (18mo) peaked £970 from HA Edmunds. A run of Pure Bred Devon steers and Pedigree heifers (16mo) from Manor Farm Plant Hire met a brisk trade to £790 and £715 respectively. **YOUNG CONTINENTALS**

Some very smart runs of young Continentals this week with plenty of steers selling in advance of £800. Cracking Charolais steers (9-15mo) from Mike Hoppe topped at a massive £1048. Other steers met a flying demand with Limousins to £890 from Jacob Hares and Blues to £880 from Manor & Auckland. Heifers were more scarce this week but those on offer still met a buoyant demand. Blues again from Manor & Auckland topped at £802 with Limousins to £768 from JH & JA Cool. Both the suckled and dairy bred cattle were keenly contested and more of all breeds would have sold to advantage.

Stringent measures are now in force, specifically **DNA testing**, when animals enter rearing units and/or at the point of slaughter to check that they are by the registered sire provided.

**If at point of sale you are not 100% sure, please DO NOT sell your animal(s) with a sire.**

The financial implications of providing an incorrect sire at point of sale will be considerable.

## **ANGUS**

Another sensational trade for the Angus cattle of all ages. Yearling Angus steers met a storming trade to £950 from David Watts and £925 from Richard & Judy Holdway with others easily to £815 from Kenny Rostigina and £812 Rolf Park Farm. Weaned Angus steers (7mo) sold well to £700 from Ranston Farms. Named Sire Angus heifers peaked at £798 again from David Watts with others easily to £700 from Rolf Park Farm and £672 from Pottick Pigs. A large entry of forward cattle met a cracking demand with the best types easily selling in advance of £1000. Well presented steers from North Buckham Farm topped the day at £1200 with others to £1128 from Rolf Park Farm, £1090 from A & J Forster, £1090 from GA & NIS Coffin, £1035 from ET Farwell & Son and £1030 from WD & VJ Masters. Forward heifers from GA & NIS Coffin peaked at £1090 with others to £1040 from EN RG & MJ Ractliffe and £1010 from EG Hedges & Son. Bulling heifers wanted from £870 from F Denning & Son to £962 from Rolf Park Farm.

## **HEREFORDS**

Not too many younger cattle on offer this week with very young Hereford steers (6mo) wanted to £545 from A Smart. Yearling Hereford steers (12-15mo) sold well from £700 with the best to £820 from Peter Read. The stronger forward Herefords met a buoyant demand with the overage steers topping at £1135 from D Harrison & Sons. Underage steers topped at £1050 from EN RG & MJ Ractliffe, £1045 from RJ & S Mckie, £1042 from J & WR Adams, £958 from Wickham Farm Partners and £925 from F Denning & Son. Younger steers with farming potential regularly settled in advance of £850 to £878 from J trot & Son and £852 from JD Jenkins & Son.

## **FRIESIANS**

A better show of young Friesians this week with a well presented pen of 10 British steers to £525 from JH Attwell & Son with others from the same home to £460. Young Fleckveih steers (5mo) from MW & LJ Baker met a firm trade to £325. Medium farming sorts sparked a solid trade from £650 to £775 from RJ & S Mckie, £750 from KJ Simpson, £740 from DB & A Fry, £700 from Rolf Park Farm and £670 from Evershot Farms. The stronger fleshed types today topped at £850 from Wickham Farm Partners whilst a run from TJ Bourne ranged from £780 to £818.

## **FORWARD CONTINENTALS**

Trade perhaps a little less emphatic than recent weeks but nevertheless all the well presented quality cattle still sold to a brisk demand. The best steers today topped at £1195 for Charolais from WD & VJ Masters. A smart consignment of 33 Charolais steers and heifers from Mike Hoppe averaged a massive £1044 with his steers topping at £1100 and heifers at £1028. An entry of well fleshed steers from SC & JA Eavis sold well with their Simmentals to £1175, Blues to £1165 and Charolais to £1165. Plenty of Limousin steers sparked a brisk trade to £1100 from C & Smart, £1070 from Wickham Farm Partners and £1068 from RJ & S Mckie with younger sorts (17mo) to £1036 from GA & NIS Coffin. Plenty of other steers with good conformation and potential met a fast demand from £1000. Some smart heifers from EN RG & MJ Ractliffe set the trade with their Blues to £1100 closely followed by G & SM Dixon who achieved £1035. Limousin heifers topped at £1020 from RJ & S Mckie whilst younger bulling sorts were keenly contested to £975 from GA & NIS Coffin. A useful entry of Simmental heifers from SH & RS Weeden peaked at £955 with other Blues to £948 from PW CC & JC Gould. Most heifers with good conformation and farming potential

sold in advance of £800. The leaner types lacking flesh and conformation for their age were a little more difficult to place than of late.

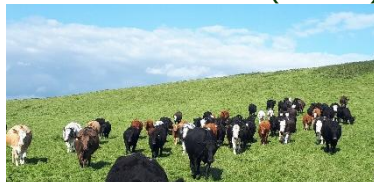
